Travel to Oxford:

Rail

Oxford is on the main line between Birmingham and London and is accessible from most major towns. Trains run at least once an hour between Oxford and London, and twice an hour during peak times. Oxford is also on the main cross-country routes.

Oxford train station is around 25 minutes' walk from St Hilda's. There is a good taxi service from the station, and several buses (U1, 4A, 4B, 4C) stop on St Clements, close to the college.

Coach/bus

National Express buses run to and from Oxford to locations throughout the UK. The <u>Oxford Tube</u> runs from London (Victoria, Marble Arch, Notting Hill Gate, Shepherd's Bush and Hillingdon) to Oxford every 10-30 minutes depending on time of day. The central coach station is around 20 minutes' walk from the college.

Air

If you have a choice, we recommend you fly to London Heathrow which is the most convenient for Oxford. The <u>airline buses</u> run regularly from London Heathrow (and London Gatwick) to Oxford. The bus stops in St Clements, close to St Hilda's.

Driving

Parking in Oxford is unfortunately difficult and expensive, and there is no parking available at the college. If you are driving, we strongly recommend using the park-and-ride.

Park-and-ride

There are several park-and-rides available on the outskirts of Oxford. They are all clearly sign-posted, are linked to the centre of the city by regular bus services, and are open 24 hours per day (bus services run until about 11pm). <u>http://parkandride.oxfordbus.co.uk/where-to-park/</u> The Thornhill P&R, on the A40 to the east of Oxford, offers the best access as the bus stops in St Clements, near the college. The bus from the Pear Tree P&R (north) and Redbridge (south) stop in the city centre, a 15-20 minute walk to the college.
